



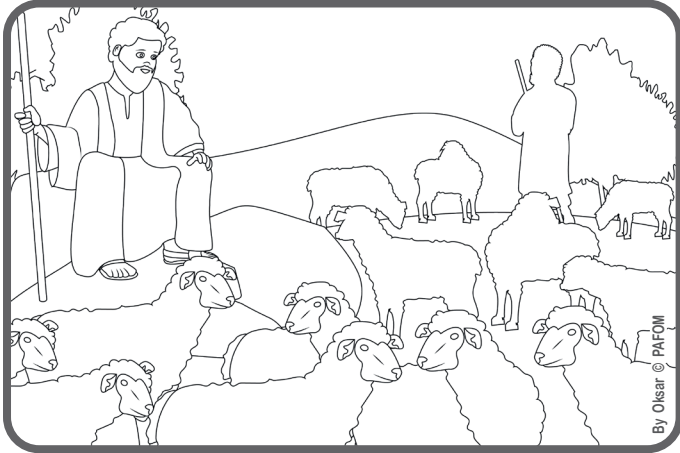
Let's take care of the people around us

"The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want" (Ps 23:1).

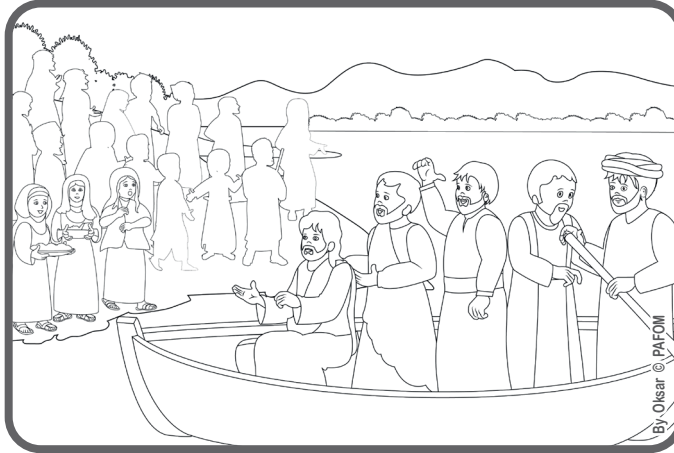
