

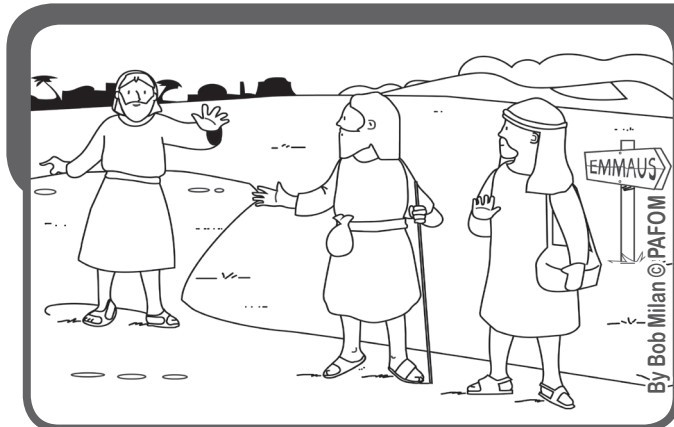
Let's console those who are sad



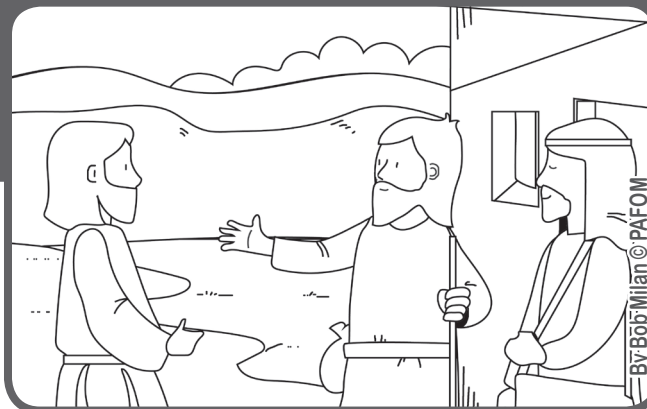
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“Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted” (Mt 5:4)

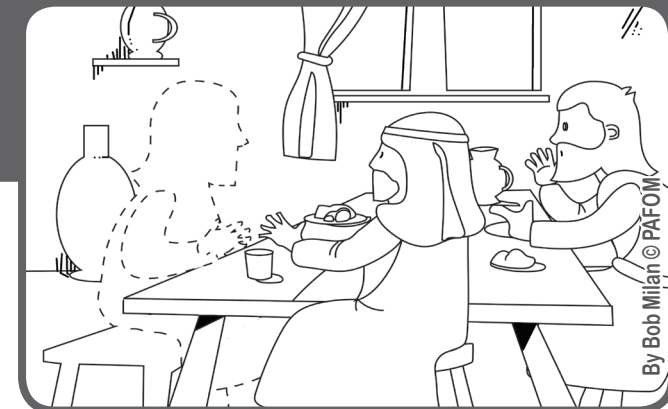
An example of this is the story of the disciples at Emmaus (see Lk 24:13-32).



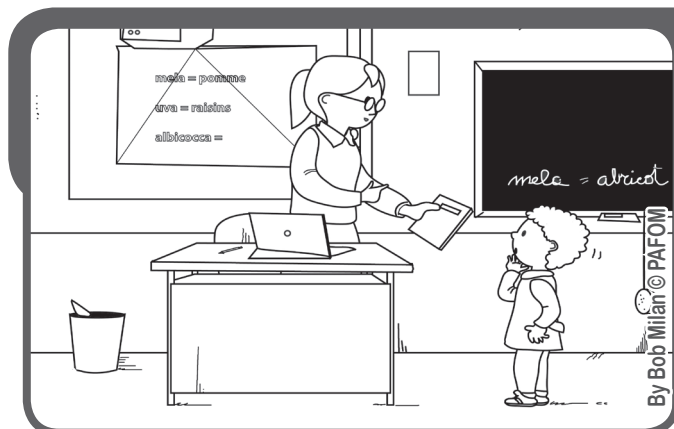
Jesus had just been killed and two of his followers left Jerusalem, feeling very sad. Along the road they met a stranger who started walking with them.



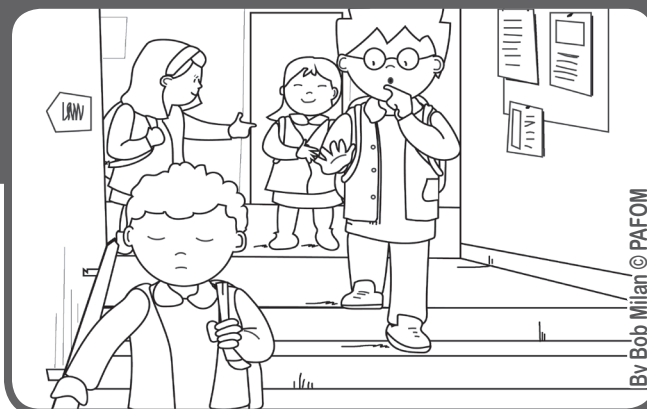
The stranger consoled them by explaining that Jesus had been victorious, even though he was killed. The disciples began to feel happier and invited him to stay with them for dinner.



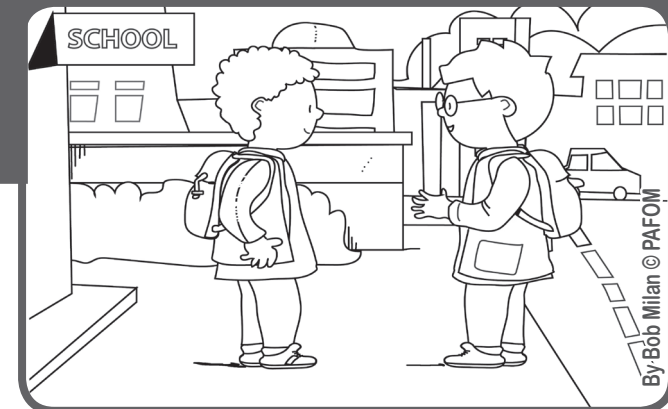
