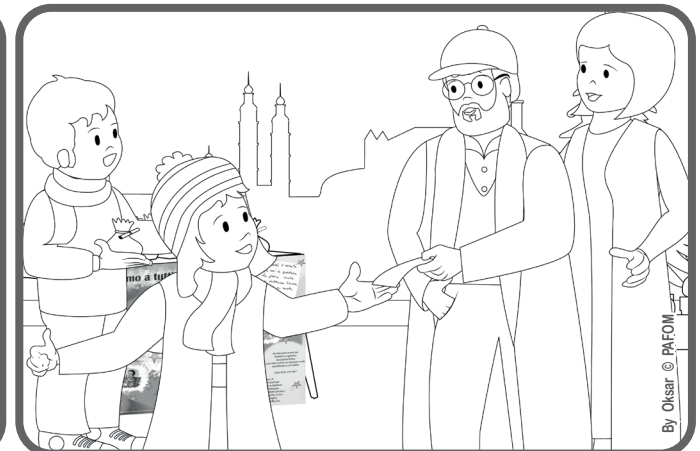
He told the others: "This poor woman gave more than all the others! The rich ones only gave their extra money and instead she, who is so poor, gave all she had to live on."
